These are the critical issues that compelled him to write this book and to offer an explanation and illumination that will help readers understand their beliefs, strengthen their faith, and widen their spiritual perspective.

The book sheds light on many of the crucial issues predominantly occurring or shared in every church—abortion and birth prevention, marriage of priests, female “priests”, gay “marriage”, the language of the church, the philosophy of the church, seminary training, the liturgy, ecclesiastical globalism and veneration of the saints. Chapter X, Liberation Theology expounds the errors of this subtle theology and may stir readers interest. Special Appendices deals with Catholic Universities -- Appendix A references the Church position on Catholic Universities. Appendix B explains the Land O'Lakes Conferences and their impact on Catholic Universities, and Appendix C discusses and criticizes President Obama's visit to Notre Dame. Readers will truly find the discussions helpful and eye-opening..
